"Everyone hide in the bushes or anywhere you can't be seen."

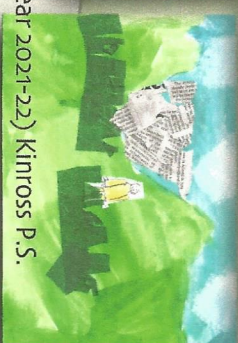
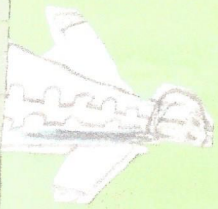
Troopers! They must have followed someone here. We ran to hide...
